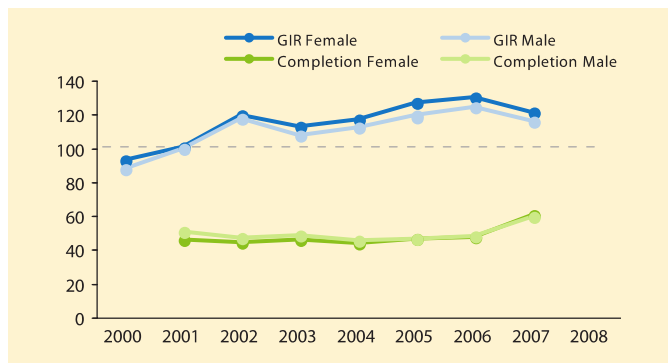
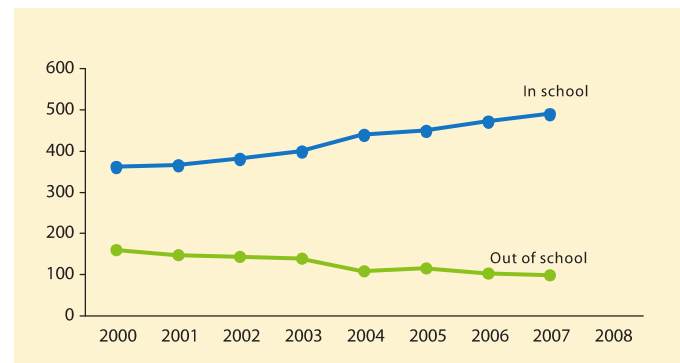


Primary Gross Intake and Completion Rates (percentage)

Total Primary Enrollment and Children Out of School (thousands)



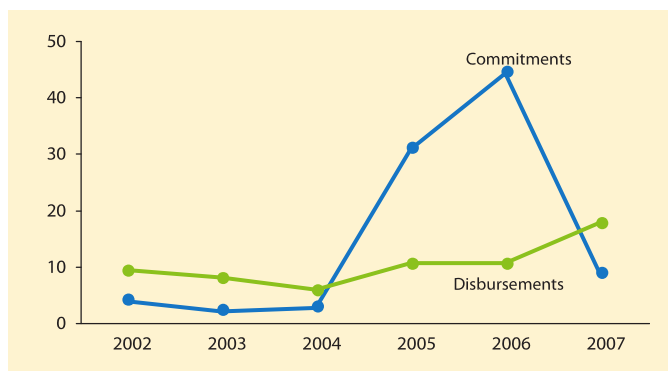

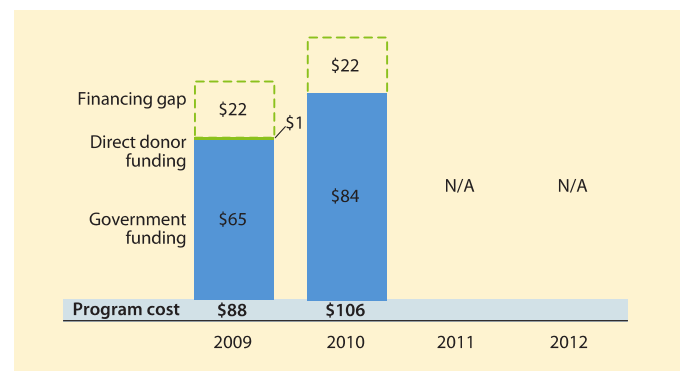
