
# Read the draft of the EPDC Report on Global Educational Trends and Give us your Comments!

#### New Data from 20 MICS3 2005/6 Datasets and 17 DHS 2006/7 Datasets

EPDC has extracted education data from MICS3 and DHS datasets, with a new addition of ECCE (Early Childhood Care and Education) indicators. Standard education extractions on participation, efficiency, attainment, and literacy have been completed for 20 MICS3 2005/6 and 17 DHS 2006/7 datasets.

MICS3 2005/6: Bangladesh, Belarus, Belize, Cote d'Ivoire, Cuba, Iraq, Jamaica, Kyrgyzstan, Macedonia, Mongolia, Montenegro, Serbia, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Syria, Tajikistan, Togo, Uzbekistan, and Vietnam

**DHS 2006/7**: Azerbaijan, Benin, Congo, Dominican Republic, Honduras, India, Jordan, Liberia, Mali, Namibia, Nepal, Niger, Pakistan, Swaziland, Uganda, Ukraine and Zimbabwe

#### More New Data

#### ECCE & Health Data from DHS and MICS3

EPDC has newly added ECCE and health indicators from two main data sources—DHS StatCompiler and MICS3 final reports and datasets.

- Pre-primary net and gross attendance rate
- Age specific pre-primary attendance rate
- Infant (age 0) and child (age 0-4) mortality rates
- Children exclusively breastfed (0-5 months)
- Children under-height for age and children under-weight for height (age 0-4)
- Vaccination rate
- Women with comprehensive knowledge of preventing HIV/AIDS transmission (age 15-49)
- Deliveries with professional assistance (age 15-49)
- Age-specific and total fertility rate (age 15-49)
- HIV prevalence rate

#### Gender Parity Index (GPI) of Gross and Net Attendance Rates

Based on EPDC extraction data from DHS datasets, EPDC has calculated gender parity index of primary and secondary gross and net attendance rates at the national, subnational, and urban/rural levels for 47 countries.

#### Per Pupil Expenditure (PPE)

Per pupil expenditure data has been calculated at the school level for 145 countries based on GNI per capita data from the WDI (World Development Indicator) and public education expenditure per student data from the UIS.

#### Child Labor Data from Understanding Children's Work (UCW)

EPDC has added two new child labor indicators—(1) children working (%) and (2) children working and attending school (%)—from year 1996 to 2006 for 68 countries from UCW.

#### School Quality and Student Performance Data from SACMEQ and Others

EPDC now has pupil teacher ratio and learning assessment and exam scores from SACMEQ and various other national sources at the national and subnational level.

#### India Education Data from DHS, UIS and India Department of School Education and Literacy

EPDC has added new India data for school years 1999 to 2007 at the national and subnational level:

- Gross and net enrolment rates and gender parity index (GPI)
- Dropout, repetition, transition, and survival to grade 5 rates
- Numbers of pupils, schools, teachers, and pupil teacher ratio (PTR)
- % of underage and overage children
- % of trained teachers

#### Primary and Secondary Gross and Net Attendance Maps

New and updated primary gross attendance and secondary gross and net attendance rate maps are available for 30 countries using the DHS extraction data from 2003 to 2007.

### 2009 EFA Global Monitoring Report Background Paper—Four Studies of Education Growth: Inequality by wealth, Age effects, Sub-national learning differentials, and Projections

EPDC was commissioned by the Education for All Global Monitoring Report team to assist in drafting the EFA Global Monitoring Report 2009 – Overcoming Inequality: Why Governance Matters. This background paper is published on UNESCO website and four studies are available separately as 2009 EPDC working papers and policy briefs (EPDC No. 09-01, 09-02, 09-03, 09-04).

### Wealth Still Matters: A Study of Wealth Differentials in Primary School Attendance from 1990-2006 in Developing Countries (EPDC No. 09-01)

This working paper examines changes in attendance differentials by wealth over time from 1990-2006 for 61 developing and transitional countries, based on household surveys and finds that school attendance differentials by wealth have declined over time in almost all countries. Declines in wealth differentials are almost universally associated with an overall increase in school attendance.

## Pupil Performance and Age: A Study of Promotion, Repetition, and Dropout Rates among Pupils in Four Age Groups in 35 Developing Countries (EPDC No. 09-02)

This working paper investigates the extent of under- and over-age pupils in developing countries and the differences in school performance by age group. The study finds that in the lower grades of primary school, older pupils generally outperform younger ones and younger pupils are far more likely to repeat grades. In higher grades of primary school and in all grades of secondary school, older pupils underperform; they are less likely to be promoted and more likely to drop out of school than younger pupils.

### Sub-national Disparities in Learning: An Analysis of Differentials in Learning Scores in 25 countries, and the Correlations with School Entry and Retention Rates and Pupil-Teacher Ratios (EPDC No. 09-03)

This working paper examines sub-national differences in student learning in 25 developing countries. The study proposes criteria for selecting the best measure of learning disparity. It finds that sub-national learning score disparity correlates poorly to the pupil-teacher ratio differentials and best to attendance rate differentials.

### Efficiency: A Study of Promotion-, Repetition-, and Dropout Rates among Pupils in Four Age-groups in Sub-Saharan Africa (EPDC No. 09-04)

This policy brief measures the extent and effects of under- and over-age school attendance among pupils in Sub-Saharan Africa based on household survey data from 22 developing countries.

#### What Works in Expanding School Participation (EPDC No. 08-07)

The paper identifies some of the key government policies responsible for the rapid expansion in primary enrollment and completion prior to 2005, and explores the likelihood of continued expansion and the implications of expansion for individuals and the countries as a whole.
